


Books *&* Bytes

Take a break from sledding, skiing or skating and come to the library and read to win this winter. While we wait for the Winter Olympics to start in Sochi, Russia in February, we invite you to “go for the gold” by joining our winter reading programs for all ages. Sign up starts December 16 and ends January 20; the last day to complete and return your reading log is January 31.

For our adult readers, books, DVDs, CDs, magazines, audiobooks, e-books, and attending a program will all count toward completing your reading log. Earn a prize for completing your log and enter a drawing for one of our great gift baskets containing some signed Blackhawks banners, DVDs, gift cards to local restaurants and more.
