SUMMER READING CHALLENGE DIG DEEPER @ YOUR LIBRARY JUNE 1 - AUGUST 9

Sign-up for our all ages challenge starting June 1 and begin tracking your minutes in Beanstack, the program we used for Winter Reading. We have simplified the challenge: one completed badge equals one ticket to a grand prize. If you read more than we challenge, you will earn additional tickets into the grand prize drawings. We recommend downloading the Beanstack Tracker app, but you may also log your reading online (caryarealibrary.beanstack.org/reader365) or print a paper log if you are not ready to take the digital leap | caryarealibrary.org/summerreading

TIPS FOR KEEPING TRACK OF YOUR READING:

- If you're reading an audiobook, check the length for the amount of minutes read
- Use the timer in the app, which you're able to pause for any interruptions or breaks
- Reading three picture books takes about 15 minutes, so if it's easier to track books, do so and then convert to minutes in Beanstack
- You do not need to log specific titles. Just select Log a Day, Minutes, or Pages Only, which will add a "No Title" book cover to your title list
- Parents with multiple children can log their childrens' minutes by selecting all the readers in the app

SAFETY & BUILDING FAQs

When will the library building reopen?

We don't know, but are planning for that eventuality. Some spaces and services will not be available immediately but will be phased into use. We will need to maintain social distancing standards to protect patrons and staff.

When will programming resume in person?

That will be determined by public health agency guidelines.

Will the meeting room and study rooms be available to use?

Neither will be immediately available to use once the building reopens. The use of these spaces will be phased in over time.

What safety measures have you taken for materials?

Returned items are quarantined for 72 hours, on the recommendation of CDC scientists. We will implement guidelines outlined in the OCLC/IMLS/Battelle study on how best to handle library materials. Staff is wearing gloves while handling items.

What cleaning have you done in the building?

All surfaces, furniture, and carpeting were thoroughly cleaned while the building has been closed.

CENSUS 2020

In March, you should have received a notice in the mail with your Census ID and directions to head online to fill it out. If it slipped your mind with all that was going on, have no fear, you can still fill out the Census and make sure that our area has a complete count. Remember that infants, elderly, and minority populations count too!
