1000 Books Before Kindergarten

We are re-launching our 1000 Books Before Kindergarten (1KBBK) program December 19 in conjunction with our Winter Reading program (more about Winter Reading on page 4) with a re-brand and renewed enthusiasm.



1KBBK is a year-round program for parents and caregivers to equip their child(ren) for school by reading 1000 books before they enter Kindergarten.

Becky Oberhauser, Youth and Teen Services Manager, explained "Not only does reading with your child provide a great bonding experience and help them with their social and emotional learning, it is also the best thing you can do to set them up for academic success."

Upon sign-up, you'll receive a small canvas bag for your checkouts. You'll track 100 books at a time on our new "caterpillar" logs, as well as on a fun, colorful display in the Children's Area. Your child will earn a sticker for each completed log and you will be provided with early literacy tips to help you maximize this important time with your child. When you've completed the program, you'll earn a book to keep in your personal library.

New Memory Care Kit Collection

We are excited to announce that the Cary Area Public Library has been awarded a \$1500 grant through the Rotary Club of Cary-Grove. The funding will be used to create Memory Care Kits for those with dementia and their caregivers.

Barb Riley, our Program Coordinator, shared her excitement: "Having worked previously in the memory care field for several years, I'm attuned to the need for quality of life for people with dementia and their caregivers. My hope is that these kits will offer new and meaningful ways to connect that encompass the whole person and not just focus on the negatives of the disease."

Community Engagement Liaison and partner on this project, Hannah Bovino, added "We wanted to provide a positive and accessible way for caregivers, family members, and friends to engage with their loved ones. I think something that will make our collection unique is the wellbeing support included for caregivers."

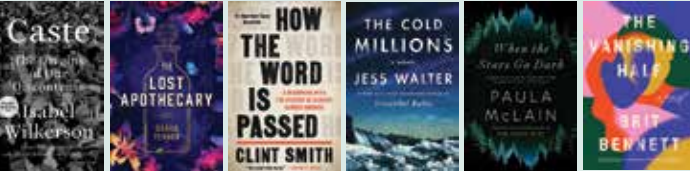

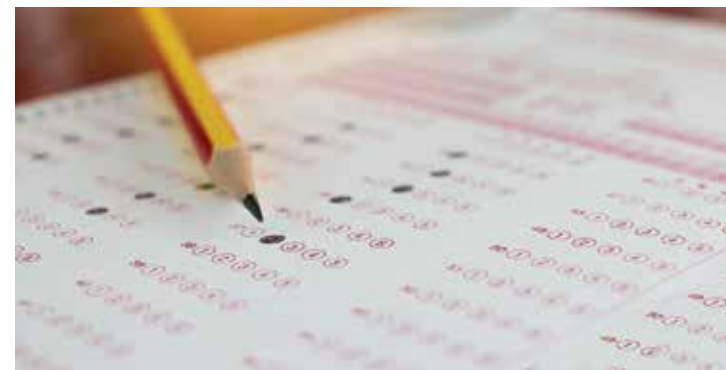
